### ***VOTING & ELECTION INFORMATION***

#### **2018 PPCC Area and At-large Representatives Election**

*Notice of Ballot Availability:* Ballots for the election of Area Representatives and the At-large Representative to the Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) are made available to all community members (including residents, business operators and property owners in Pacific Palisades) in the following way:

- **Online ballots** (electronic voting procedure) are available by clicking on the **Vote** button on the PPCC website, [www.pacpalicc.org](http://www.pacpalicc.org), starting **August 9 at 9pm**. *[Note: There will be no paper ballots.] Voting will end on August 30 at 9pm.*
- **A voting “help” session** will take place on **August 18, 10am-1pm**, in the Palisades Branch Library meeting room. PPCC volunteers/members of the Election Committee will be present to assist community members who are unable to access the online ballot. Computers and digital devices will be available. Attendees without a personal email address must bring a government-issued ID or other proof of residency. Eligible voters who need assistance but cannot attend the “help” session may contact Election Committee Chair David Card at 310-454-5024 or [ElectionPPCC@gmail.com](mailto:ElectionPPCC@gmail.com).

**Eligibility:** All individuals at least 18 years old as of August 30 who reside in Pacific Palisades are eligible to vote for an Area Representative in the Area in which they reside. Individuals at least 18 years old as of August 30 who reside in, or own real property in, or operate a business located in Pacific Palisades are eligible to vote for the At-large Representative. Constituents are invited to learn more about the candidates and their positions in the following ways:

- **August 9** at 7pm: Candidates introduce themselves (2 minutes each) at the PPCC meeting, Palisades Branch Library. Candidates for contested seats are invited to answer questions.
- **Now until August 30:** View the Candidate Statements on the PPCC website. Candidates will also take constituents’ questions via email (contact info for all candidates on the PPCC website).

Polls open (on-line voting begins): **9pm on August 9**

Voting “help” session: **10am-1pm on August 18**  
(must bring ID if no email address)

Polls close (on-line voting ends): **9pm on August 30**
