VOTING & ELECTION INFORMATION

2020 PPCC Area and At-large Representatives Election

Notice of Ballot Availability: Ballots for the election of Area Representatives and the At-large Representative to the Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) are made available to all community members (including residents, business operators and property owners in Pacific Palisades) in the following way:

- Online ballots (electronic voting procedure) are available by clicking on the red Vote button on the PPCC website, <u>www.pacpalicc.org</u>, starting September 4 at 9am. [Note: There will be no paper ballots.] Voting will end on September 18 at 5pm.
- Eligible voters who need assistance may contact Election Committee Chair David Kaplan at <u>dkaplan6@gmail.com</u>.

Eligibility: All individuals at least 18 years old as of September 4 who reside in Pacific Palisades are eligible to vote for an Area Representative in the Area in which they reside. Individuals at least 18 years old as of September 4 who reside in, or own real property in, or operate a business located in Pacific Palisades are eligible to vote for the At-large Representative. There are 12 candidates for seven Area Representative seats and there is 1 candidate for the At-large Representative seat his year. The candidates and their statements are posted on the PPCC website at <u>www.pacpalicc.org</u>.

Constituents are invited to learn more about the candidates and their positions in the following ways:

- August 27, 5:30pm: Candidates for contested seats will introduce themselves & candidates for uncontested seats may introduce themselves (2 minutes each) at the PPCC special meeting/Candidates Forum, held via Zoom videoconference (meeting log-in information in the agenda to be posted on the PPCC website). Candidates for contested seats will be asked to answer questions posed by the Election Committee Chair (1 minute for each answer). The audience will then be invited to ask additional questions of all candidates, time allowing (1 minute for each answer).
- Now until September 18: View the Candidate Statements on the PPCC website. Candidates will also take constituents' questions via email (contact info for all candidates on the PPCC website).
