(amendments to City Council motions)

Item 8.1.1(a) – CF 20-1170 (Ryu motion for ICO/temporary construction halt)

Text of motion amendment, approved by Council PLUM committee (from CD4 Planning Director Emma Howard):

“I THEREFORE MOVE that the City Council instruct Streets LA and Department of Building and Safety, in consultation with the Los Angeles Fire Department, Department of City Planning, City Attorney, Bureau of Engineering, Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst and any other departments deemed necessary, to prepare and present a variety of enforcement options to address ingress, egress and potential evacuation bottlenecks in hillside VHFHSZ that are at highest risk of wildfires and most restricted in emergency vehicle access, including but not limited to preparing an ICO or any other timely approach for establishing and enforcing ongoing temporary multi-day suspensions of large vehicle hauling and staging activities on these streets during highest fire risk days in locations and at times which the LAFD determines to be highest priority.”

As of 11/12/20: Motion not yet scheduled for hearing in City Council.

Item 8.2.1(b) – CF 20-1213 (Bonin motion related to the VHFHSZ & evacuation routes)

Summary of motion amendment, approved by Council PLUM committee (from CD11 Senior Planning Deputy Jason Douglas):

“The amendment directs City Planning to provide comprehensive climate vulnerability assessments that identify the unique risks climate change poses to the City and each of the Community Plan Areas to inform policy updates.

While the amendment does not explicitly mention flooding and tsunami risk due to climate change, the purpose and intent of the amendment is for DCP to assess each community plan area for their unique risks to more intense and frequent wildfires and flooding, historic droughts, record-breaking storms, extreme heat events, sea level rise, etc.”
