## 2022 PPCC Area and At-large Representatives Election

Notice of Ballot Availability: Ballots for the election of Area Representatives and the At-large Representative to the Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) are made available to all community members (including residents, business operators and property owners in Pacific Palisades) in the following ways:

## Ballot Availability

- Online ballots (electronic voting procedure) will be available by clicking on the red Vote button on the PPCC website, <u>www.pacpalicc.org</u>, starting August 19 at 8am. Voting will end on September 2 at 9pm. There will be no paper ballots.
- Eligible voters who need assistance may email questions to the Election Committee at vp@pacpalicc.org.

Eligibility: All individuals at least 18 years old as of September 2, 2022 who reside in Pacific Palisades are eligible to vote for an Area Representative in the Area in which they reside and for the At-large Representative. Individuals at least 18 years old as of September 2, 2022 who do not reside in, but who own real property in or operate a business located in Pacific Palisades, are eligible to vote only for the At-large Representative. There are ten candidates for eight Area Representative seats and there is one candidate for the At-large Representative seat this year. The list of candidates and their statements are posted on the PPCC website at <a href="https://www.pacpalicc.org">www.pacpalicc.org</a>. There shall be no write-in candidates.

Constituents are invited to learn more about the candidates and their positions in the following ways:

- August 11, 6:00pm: The PPCC Candidates Forum (runtime of 45 minutes) will be held via Zoom video conference during the regular PPCC Board Meeting (meeting log-in information can be found in the agenda to be posted on the PPCC website). During the forum, all candidates will have the opportunity to introduce themselves (1 minute each). Candidates for contested seats will be asked to address questions posed by the Election Committee Chair (1 minute for each answer). The audience will then be invited to ask additional questions of all candidates via the Zoom chat (1 minute for each answer). Any audience questions that do not get addressed within forum time limits will be sent to the candidates by the Election Committee Chair, and the answers will be posted on the PPCC website. Finally, all candidates will have the opportunity to make closing remarks (30 seconds each).
- Now until September 2: Candidate Statements can be viewed on the PPCC website.
  Candidates will also take constituents' questions via email (contact info for all candidates is on the PPCC website).
