The Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC), representing the most broad-based voice of the Pacific Palisades community since 1973, voted on October 13, 2022, at our regularly scheduled board meeting, which is open to the public, to support Brentwood Community Council (BCC) in their call for review of the recent dispensary that has been permitted to operate in their community, without prior community notice. The location of the business is perilously close to a nearby LAUSD Middle School while also being at the heart of a commercial center that attracts kids and families. The location has already experienced two break-ins, which have prompted the attention of LAPD and raised due alarm in the Brentwood community as well as the outlying areas that could be adversely impacted, including Pacific Palisades.

# Meeting Notes

## WRAC Mobility and Transportation Committee

Wednesday, October 19, 2022 – 7:05 to 8:30 PM

- 1) Call to Order and Committee Member Roll Call – Chair Selena Inouye presiding
- 2) Public Comment for Items Not on the Agenda - none
- 3) Adoption of the Agenda & Approval of Minutes – August & September
- 4) Special Orders
  - a) Mobility and Transportation reports – Eric Bruins, Jay Greenstein (none - neither were at the meeting)
- 5) Old Business
  - a) Follow-up on previously passed MTC motions - none
    - i) Speed Limit Reductions – PPCC and WNC (deadline October 2022)
    - ii) Pilot Automated Speed Enforcement – DRNC and WNC (deadline October 2022)
  - b) Update on the Venice Blvd. Mobility Improvements project – A schedule for various resurfacing projects has been emailed by StreetsLA. Motion passed to not support the project until more information is provided about the deflection of Venice Blvd. traffic to parallel streets.
  - c) Update on the Metro Sepulveda Transit Corridor project – UCLA has supported an on-campus station with the support of stakeholders. UCLA is now wavering by supporting monorail or subway. Andrew Lewis moved that the subway alternative be supported and the monorail alternative be opposed. He reasoned that elected officials and decision makers were expressing or making their decisions on the mode and route now and the WRAC would lose influence if they waited to make a recommendation until the Draft EIR was complete and Metro was considering adoption of its Locally Preferred Alternative for the corridor. Steve Lantz expressed his opposition to taking a position until the DEIR is released and Metro selects the Locally Preferred Alternative. Others supported both choices. The motion failed with two supporting, two opposing and two abstentions.
