Re: Request for ranger support at the George Wolfberg Park at Potrero Canyon (GWPPC)

Dear Councilmember Traci Park,

At our first meeting of the year, on January 12, 2023, the board of the Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) - the most broad based, representative, voice of the Palisades community since 1973, moved unanimously to ask your esteemed offices to secure the support of Park Rangers from the Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks to help fortify the enforcement of posted signs and their attendant Los Angeles Municipal Code sections, throughout the George Wolfberg Park at Potrero Canyon.

We thank you for the LA City Council Motion you set in motion soon after taking office as the newly elected City Councilmember for Council District 11, and for passing that Motion, which requested the support of Rangers to enforce Park rules (including operating hours from sunrise to sunset).

The Pacific Palisades Park Advisory Board (PAB) has also now convened their first meeting of the year, and they have also resolved to ask for the help of Park Rangers at the Palisades Recreation Center, whose staff has been tasked with management of the GWPPC. Their request to the LA City Department of Recreation and Parks will amplify our community voice to urgently request the support of Park Rangers at this newly opened, passive, park with a delicate riparian habitat, that is intended to be safe for use by all Angelenos from sunrise to sunset.
