*Bus Lane Parking Violation Automated Camera Enforcement (Now moot. This has already been adopted by L.A. City Council so we will not be taking it up.)*

Only two councils have passed this and PPCC has traditionally shies away from camera enforced laws. This one impacts our community differently because an important bus lane on Sunset Boulevard, tuning right onto Temescal Canyon Road (leading to PCHS) is often encumbered by illegal parking in the mornings and slows down traffic considerably.
