Dear Councilmembers Park, Hernandez, Lee and Hutt,

The Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) has been the most broad-based, representative voice of Pacific Palisades since 1973. We have recently seen the opening of the George Wolfberg Park at Potrero Canyon (GWPPC) and are now proudly the host community for this beautiful new regional passive park. The Park has long been promised to be a sunrise to sunset park with operating hours that are posted from sunrise to sunset, secured with trilogy locks that automatically unlock and lock at those hours. As such, the city attorney has proposed the amendment of section 63.44.B. 14(c) of Article 3, Chapter VI of the Los Angeles Municipal Code to add George Wolfberg Park at Potrero Canyon to the list of parks with specific opening and closing hours, by adding, in alphabetical order, the George Wolfberg Park at Potrero Canyon to the list of City parks that are identified as being “Closed at Sunset, open at Sunrise.

We fully support this draft ordinance and urge you to do the same. City officials have long promised the Palisades community – dating back, at least, to express representations made in the 1985 EIR for the Potrero Canyon Park project, and in repeated public and private assurances to residents in the ensuing 38 years – that the hours of operation for this large, passive regional park would be from sunrise to sunset. This is a significant matter of public safety and we urge the Neighborhoods and Community Enrichment Committee to support the adoption of this ordinance amendment.

The Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) has called for signage specifying that the park's hours of operation from sunrise to sunset, and submitted the linked letter in November of 2022: <https://pacpalicc.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/11/GW-park-at-PC-Signage.pdf> . We thank you in advance for your swift support of this amendment to add the passive George Wolfberg Park at Potrero Canyon to the list of LA City Parks that open to the public at sunrise, and close at sunset.
