11.1. <u>Replacement trees for Pali Rec Center Playground.</u> EC sponsored motion. PPCC donated 3 Torrey Pines for the playground as our contribution to the "100 Trees for 100 Years" tree planting project for our Palisades Centennial. Unfortunately, they died (possibly due to too much moisture/rain). They need to be replaced.

Palisades Forestry Committee recommends that PPCC buy 3 15 gallon Quercus tomentella / Island Oaks for the playground area. Wholesale price is \$75.99 each, for a total of \$227.97 + \$195 delivery + sales tax = approximately \$475. The wholesale nursery/grower says they'll be ready for sale around June.
