Re: SB 495 (Allen; the "Eliminate the List" bill) / hearing in Judiciary 4/29/25 -- SUPPORT

Dear Senators:

Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) has for 52 years been the voice of Pacific Palisades – the community that was devastated by the Palisades Fire. Our constituents are still suffering on all levels, including emotionally and financially, from this unprecedented, tragic event.

The PPCC Executive Committee believes that constituents who have already suffered enough from the massive tragedy should not be forced by insurers to undergo the painful process of itemizing every single item of personal property lost in the fire to receive full payment on their claims. Although we understand that some insurers have voluntarily agreed to forego this onerous requirement, detailed inventories of personal property losses are still required in many cases. SB 495 would end this practice by mandating that 100% of such claims arising from wildfires be paid without requiring victims to provide detailed inventories.

Acting on behalf of the PPCC Board, pursuant to PPCC's bylaws, the PPCC Executive Committee therefore advises that **PPCC strongly supports SB 495** and urges the Judiciary Committee members, as well as all Senators and Assemblymembers, to vote YES on the bill when it comes to them for a vote.

Thank you for your consideration and anticipated prompt attention to this important matter.
