About

The Pacific Palisades Community Recovery Coordination Council (CRCC) was established by community leaders and volunteers to facilitate coordinated action, community collaboration and consistent communication in the aftermath of the fire. Its core purpose is to ensure that community priorities are clearly communicated, integrated into official recovery planning and reflected in funding and implementation decisions.

To support a community-led recovery, the CRCC developed and manages the Pacific Palisades Recovery & Rebuild Framework (“Framework”), which organizes community engagement through Advisory Task Forces (ATFs). These ATFs are structured to align with FEMA and California Office of Emergency Services (OES) Recovery Support Functions (RSFs), as well as other locally identified needs, ensuring effective coordination between the community and public agencies.

The ATFs are volunteer working groups focused on specific recovery areas. They develop subject-matter expertise, gather in-depth community input, and help ensure that local priorities are incorporated into the Long-Term Recovery Plan and its implementation. The ATFs work in tandem with PPCC’s established committees — Infrastructure, Land Use and Emergency Preparedness — and in partnership with City, County, State and Federal agencies to identify and address critical needs and opportunities throughout the recovery process.

The CRCC oversees and guides the ATFs and, based on their work, makes recommendations to Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC)—the recognized “voice of the community” for over 53 years. Through the Framework, community input is translated into coordinated recommendations, PPCC policy positions and advocacy to decision-makers and government partners in support of the community’s immediate needs, priorities and long-term vision. The ATFs are advisory to PPCC and the CRCC, which in turn manages the ATFs and is itself advisory to PPCC. As such, the CRCC and ATFs functionally operate as PPCC ad hoc committees. This structure, and the formation and appointment of CRCC and ATF members, have been approved by PPCC's President. Under PPCC's bylaws, the President has discretion to appoint any and all PPCC ad hoc committees (Bylaws, Art. V.4). The President is not restricted as to the focus, subject matter, membership or names of PPCC ad hoc committees. In this case, the CRCC and ATFs were formed and appointed to guide PPCC and provide an opportunity for more voices, discussion, coordination and collaboration as we navigate the community’s recovery in this unprecedented time.

Membership

The CRCC is intentionally composed of representatives from a broad cross-section of Pacific Palisades stakeholders impacted by the fire, including residents (single-family, multi-family, condominiums, apartments and mobile homes), businesses, property owners, schools (LAUSD), faith-based organizations and other active community groups (such as PPCC, Pali Long Term Recovery Group, Palisades Recovery Coalition, Team Palisades, Palisades Americanism Parade Association, Fire Safe Palisades, Pali Builds and
