VOTING & ELECTION INFORMATION

2026 PPCC Area and At-large Representatives Election

Notice of Ballot Availability: Ballots for the election of Area Representatives and the At-large Representative to Pacific Palisades Community Council (PPCC) are made available to all community members (including residents, business operators and property owners in Pacific Palisades) in the following ways:

- **Ballot Availability - Online ballots** (electronic voting procedure) will be available by clicking on the red **"VOTE"** button on the PPCC website, www.pacpalicc.org, starting **August 21 at 8am. Voting will end on September 4 at 8 PM.** There will be no paper ballots.
- **Eligibility:** All individuals at least 18 years old as of Sept. 4, 2026, whose principal residence is in Pacific Palisades, are eligible to vote for an Area Representative in the Area in which they reside and for the At-large Representative. Individuals at least 18 years old as of Sept. 4, 2026, who own real property in or operate a business located in Pacific Palisades, are also eligible to vote for the At-large Representative. Individuals who evacuated after the Fire and are still living temporarily outside of Pacific Palisades are eligible to vote if they intend to return to their principal residence address in Pacific Palisades (as of January 7, 2025), or to another address in Pacific Palisades as their permanent principal residence. The ballot will include a statement for voters to sign, affirming their intent to return. For further information, visit PPCC's website, www.pacpalicc.org, or email info@pacpalicc.org.
- Eligible voters who need assistance may email questions to the Election Committee at info@pacpalicc.org. Voters may vote from a computer, laptop, cell phone or tablet. If you don't have any devices, please email info@pacpalicc.org for help in time to get assistance well in advance of the 8 PM voting deadline on September 4, 2026.

There are seventeen candidates running in this year's election for nine seats on the PPCC Board: eight Area Rep seats and one At-large Rep seat. Six of the seats are contested, with two or three candidates running per each seat (Areas 1-5 and At-large). The list of candidates and their statements are posted on the PPCC website at www.pacpalicc.org. There shall be no write-in candidates. Constituents are invited to learn more about the candidates in the following ways:

August 13, 6:00PM: A **Candidates Forum** will be held during the regular PPCC Board meeting via Zoom. The agenda with more Forum details will be posted on www.pacpalicc.org. During the Forum, the candidates in contested seats will be introduced and may give brief introductory remarks. The Forum moderator will pose questions from the Election Committee directed to all Candidates in contested seats (one minute for each answer). *As time allows*, audience members will then be invited to pose additional questions in the chat directed to all At-large candidates or to all candidates for the Area in which the questioner resides; these questions will be curated by Election Committee members and may then be asked by the moderator (one minute for each answer). Finally, time allowing, the candidates may have the opportunity to make brief closing remarks.
